

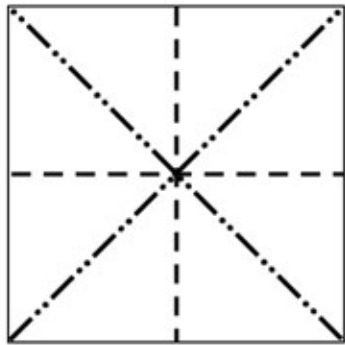

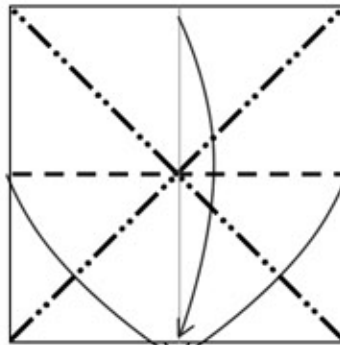


6 inch paper makes an eagle approx 4 inches long.

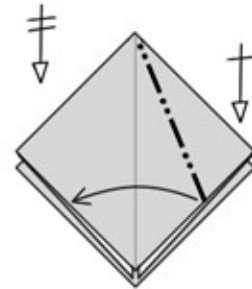
○ Begin with a Preliminary Base:



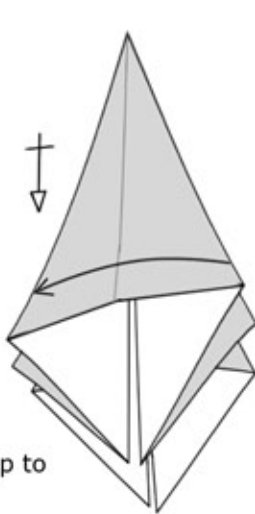
1. With white side up, fold as shown.



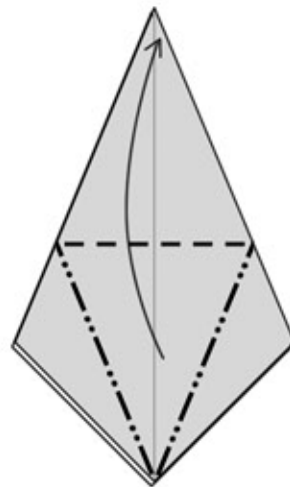
2. Collapse.



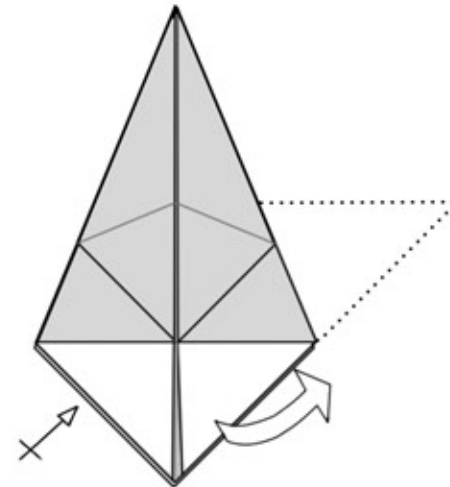
3. Finished Preliminary Base. Squash fold the top right flap to the left. Repeat on all flaps.



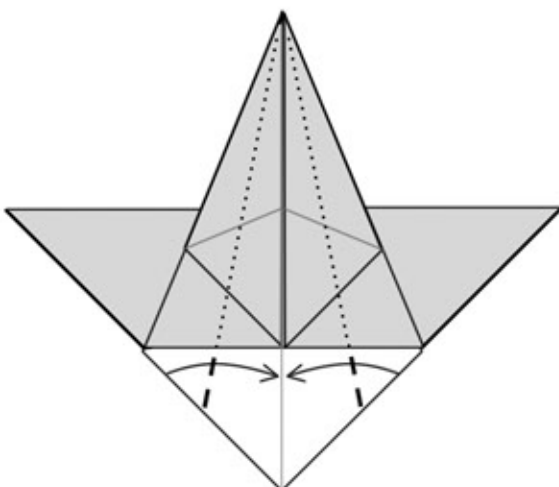
4. Fold the top flap to the left. Repeat behind.



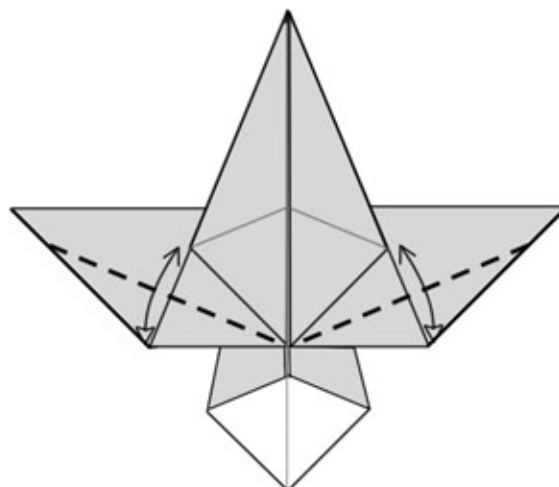
5. Petal fold.



6. Pull out the right top flap. Repeat on left.

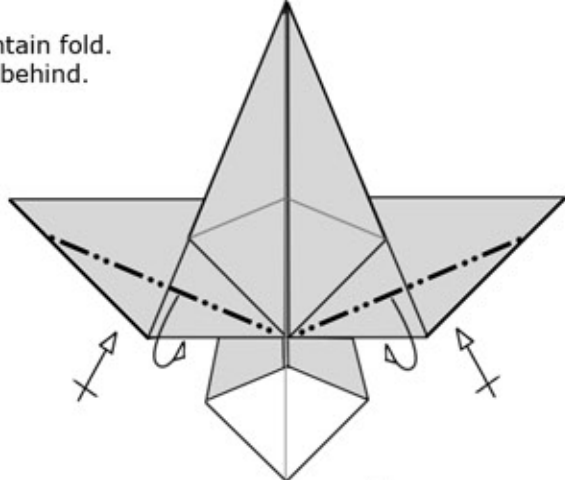


7. Valley fold the back flaps to the center. Leave a little room at the top point.

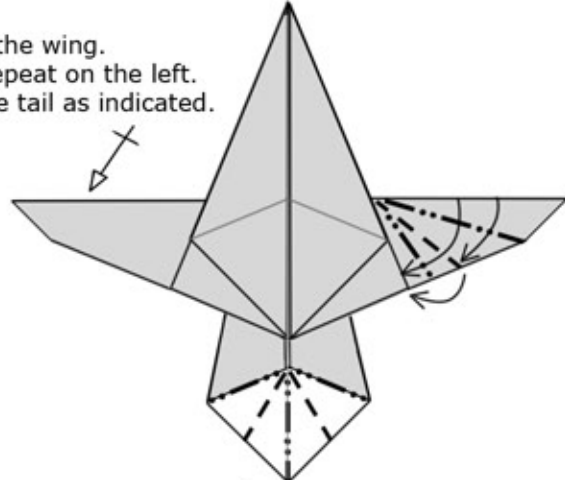


8. Valley fold both layers up. Unfold.

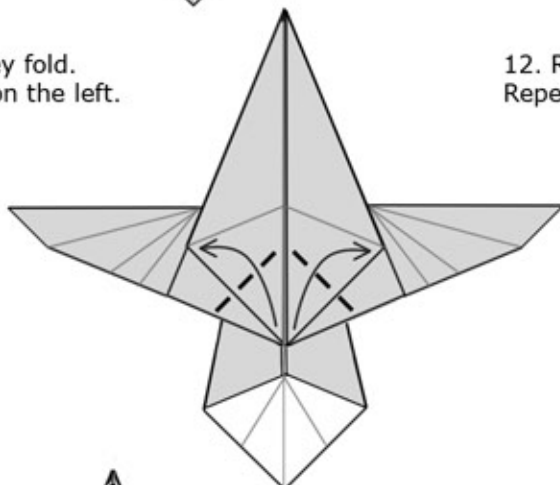
9. Mountain fold.
Repeat behind.



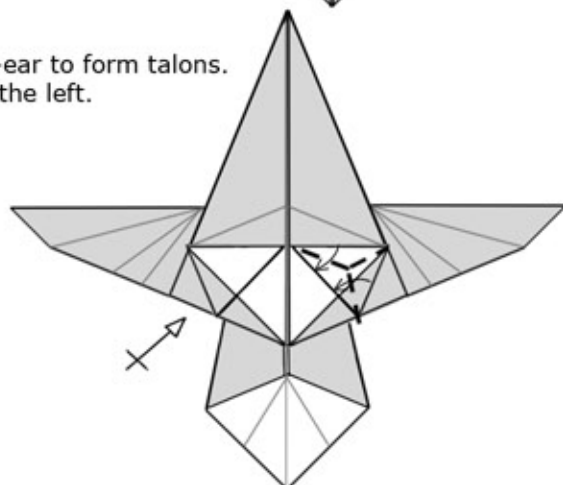
10. Pleat the wing.
Unfold. Repeat on the left.
Crease the tail as indicated.



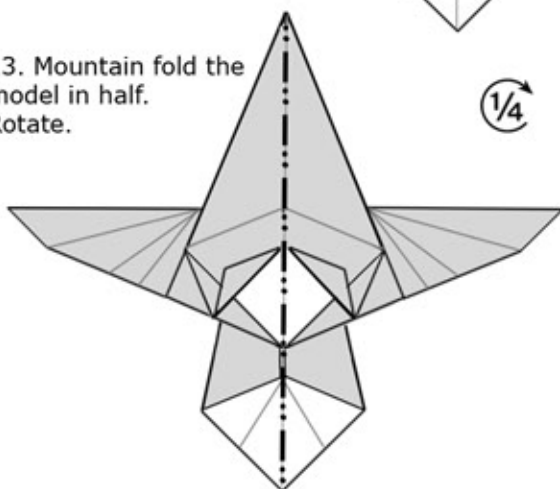
11. Valley fold.
Repeat on the left.



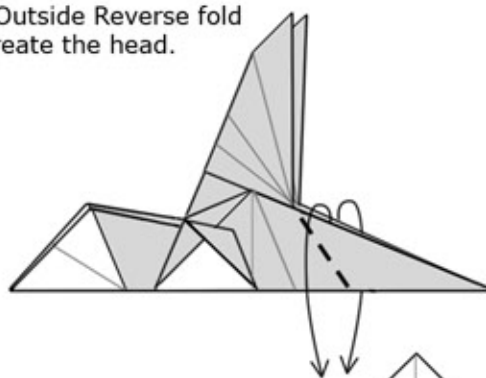
12. Rabbit-ear to form talons.
Repeat on the left.



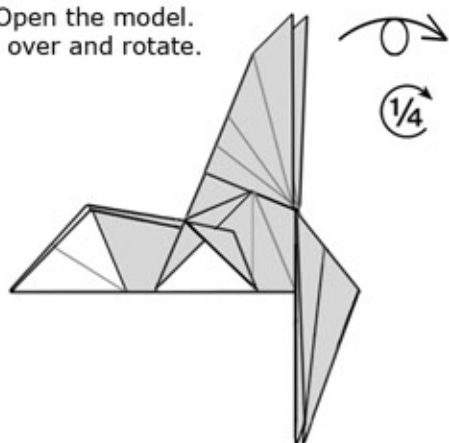
13. Mountain fold the
model in half.
Rotate.



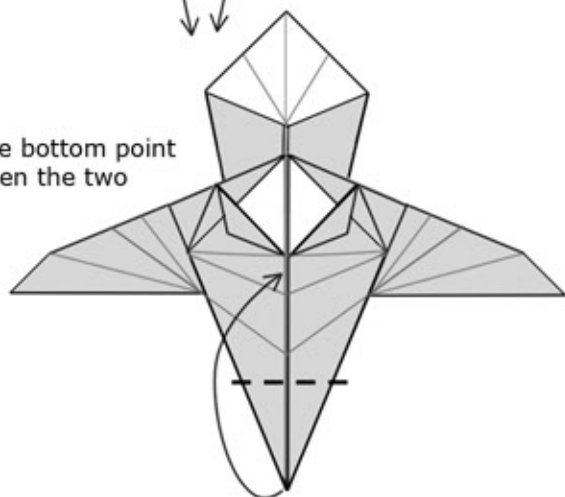
14. Outside Reverse fold
to create the head.



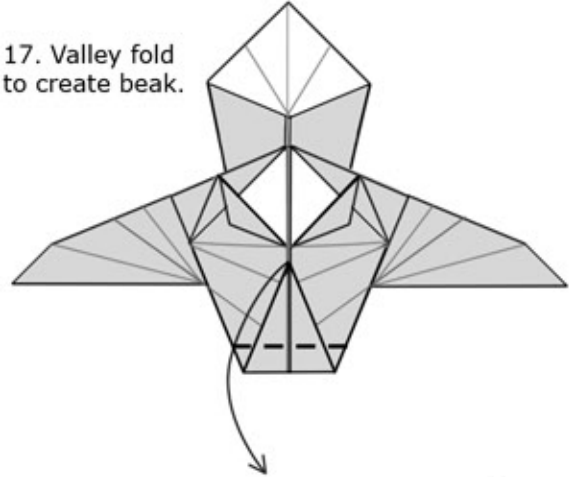
15. Open the model.
Turn over and rotate.



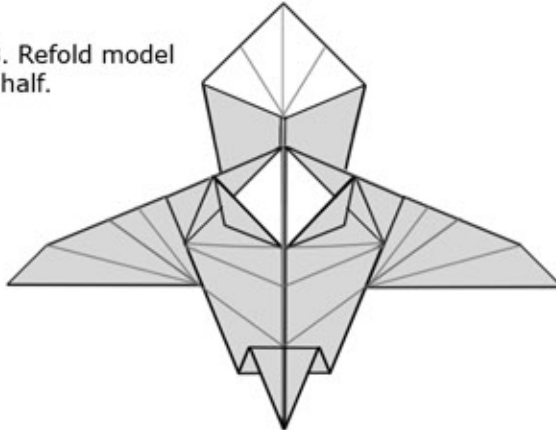
16. Valley fold the bottom point
to midway between the two
creases.



17. Valley fold
to create beak.



18. Refold model
in half.



19. Shape the tip of the
beak and talons to taste
to complete the eagle.
